

RICHMOND REGION: A PROVEN LOCATION FOR INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS

The Richmond Region is home to nearly 80,000 businesses, with everything from Fortune 1000 headquarters to two-person start-ups. More than 225 foreign affiliated firms have 260+ facilities in the Richmond Region representing nearly 30

countries. In fact, there are more than 80 French companies in Virginia and 21 are located in the Richmond Region. Nearly 1,000 foreign-owned companies operate in Virginia, employing more than 200,000 people.

Direct access to Paris and Nice is available from Washington Dulles International Airport, a two-hour drive from Richmond.

Richmond offers international partnerships with several French universities through the University of Richmond, including CIEE-Europe, ESSEC, IES Paris, NEOMA Business School, Science Po, and Université Paris Dauphine. Over 130 unique study abroad programs, internships, research, medical shadowing, and registry programs to France are offered

through Virginia Commonwealth University.

The most active organizations in the region include the Alliance Française Chapitre Rochambeau, the Richmond French Meetup Group and the French Embassy and Consulate in Washington, D.C.

Local business and cultural resources include Alliance Française, the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts, the Richmond Lions Rugby Football Club, and Central Virginia Soccer Association.

TRANSPORTATION + INFRASTRUCTURE

Richmond is strategically located at the mid-point of the East Coast, less than 160 km (100 mi) from Washington, D.C.

Three interstate highways converge in the region.

More than 45% of the nation's consumers are within a one-day drive of Richmond.

Two of the nation's largest operators, CSX and Norfolk Southern, provide rail freight service and AMTRAK provides passenger rail service.

Richmond International Airport (RIC) provides about 150 daily flights with connecting flights to destinations

worldwide. Washington Dulles International Airport (IAD), one of the nation's largest international airports, is only 190 km (120 mi) from Richmond, with more than 60 non-stop flights to international destinations.

The Richmond Marine Terminal is a multi-modal freight and distribution center on the James River. The Richmond Region's shippers are also within 160 km (100 mi) of the Port of Virginia at Hampton Roads, the 3rd largest container port on the U.S. East Coast.

WORKFORCE + SUPPORT

Greater Richmond is home to 32 four-year and two-year institutions of higher education, which train and supply the next generation of skilled professionals.

Richmond is highly educated, with nearly 70% of the population 25 and over having some college or bachelor's degree or higher.

Richmond metro area is a magnet for labor, drawing a workforce from 45 localities statewide.

The region's nationally-ranked Governor's School for Government and International Studies is available for gifted students.

Twenty-five of Virginia Commonwealth University's graduate and professional programs are ranked in U.S. News and World Report's Top 50 degree programs.

The University of Richmond ranked first in the nation for study abroad participation, with nearly 70% of its students graduating

with international experience.

The International Baccalaureate Program is available in public and private schools, exposing students to the global context of the 21st century.

Award-winning public schools are supplemented by a variety of private and parochial schools.

Workforce development courses and services are offered through the Community College Workforce Alliance.

Special weekend and evening schools offering classes in language and culture have been created by local international communities.
